- **Wednesday January 9th 2019 at 9am**

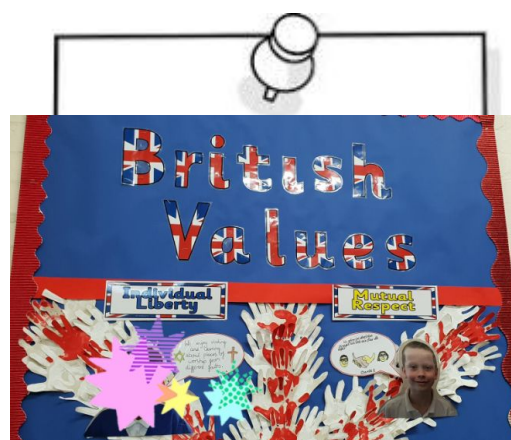

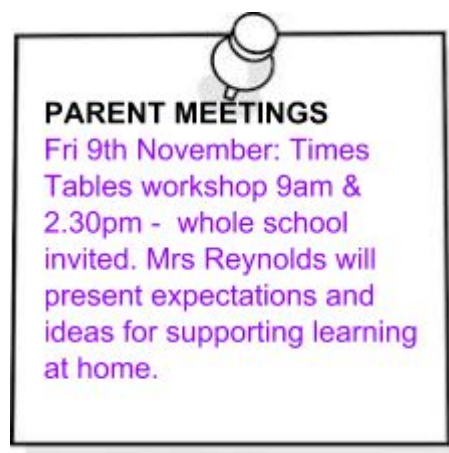
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## HOME / SCHOOL AGREEMENT
